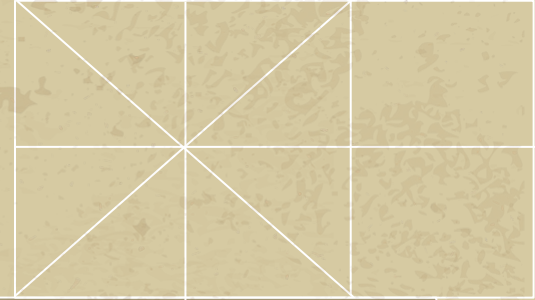

Introduction

“Through miniaturization, abstraction, exploded views, and the use of fragile materials, Rehab El Sadek’s exhibition, *Pattern Language*, brings the concept of the city and its buildings—be they governmental, corporate, or religious, and the institutional authority they convey—down to human scale. By turning buildings upside down or flying houses off the walls, El Sadek uses a change in perspective to change our perception to invite viewers to question existing power dynamics that built structures can exert over us as we encounter them.”

Brushes



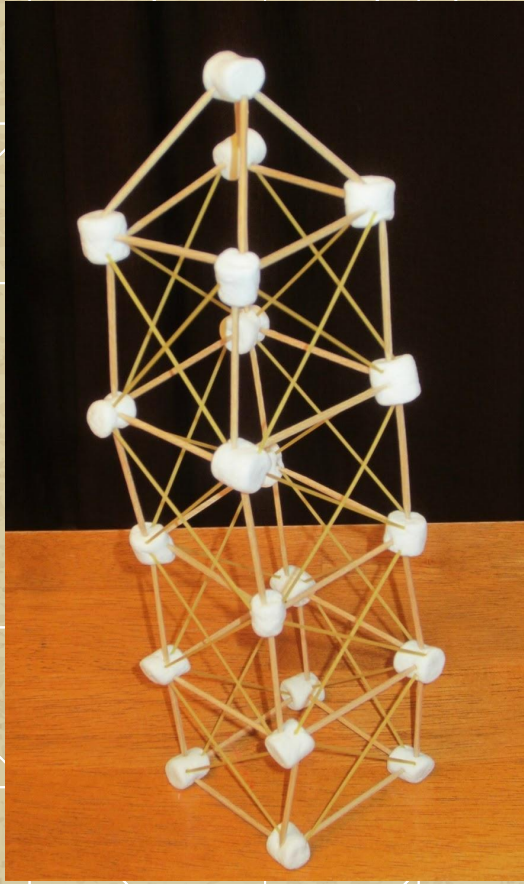
Paper Towels

- Begin building your sculpture by connecting your toothpicks together using the marshmallows.
- After you have finished building your sculpture set it aside for now.
- You may use your scissors to cut your towel into fun shapes before painting.



- You may now use your painting materials to paint on your paper towel. You may also dampen your paper towel before you begin painting it.
- After you have finished customizing your towel you will now be able to drape it over your sculpture however you would like.
- Finally, you may set your artwork aside to dry.

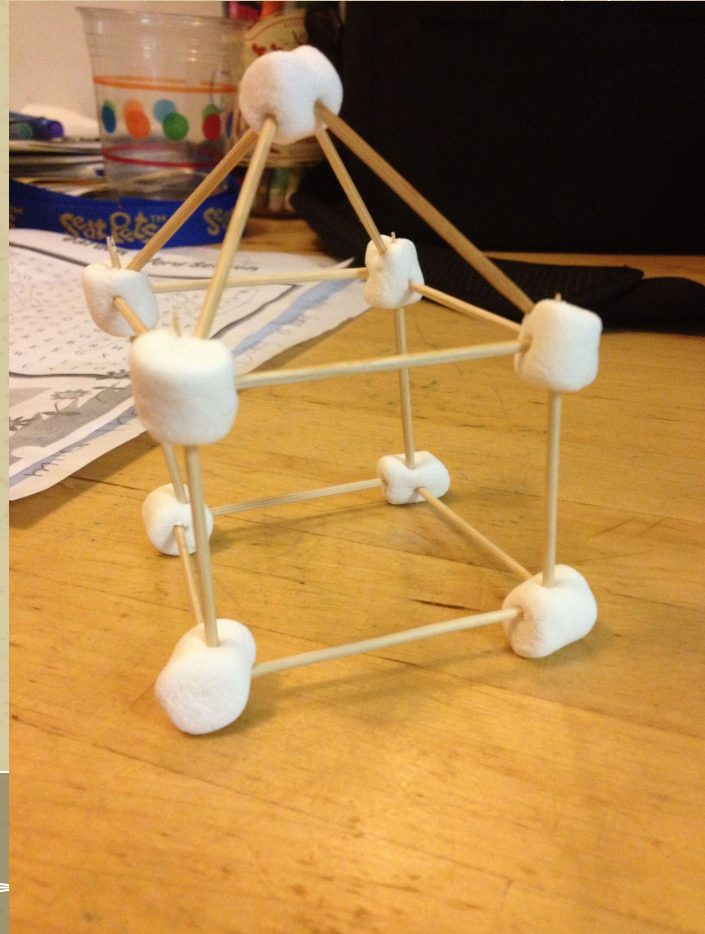
