GIFT GIVING

Number of players: Any
Space: Any
Materials needed: None

## Procedure:

Divide players into pairs and decide who is "A" and "B." "A" names and panto•mimes a non-stop series of imaginary gifts that they give to " $B$." " $B$ "'s job is to receive each of these gifts with as much enthusiasm as possible, no matter how strange or unexpected! After a set time, switch roles and repeat.

## Possible side coaching:

"Givers, work to vary the gifts you give. Give the totally unexpected!"
"Receivers, respond enthusiastically to each and every gift!"

## Variations:

Try having the gifts named by the receiver rather than by the giver.

## Processing points:

- Which did you prefer: giving or receiving? Why?
- What gifts surprised you? Why?
- What might this activity have to do with the way we work together?
